HISTORICAL NOTE

Leupp was chosen as a Citizen Isolation Camp, along with a camp in Moab, Utah, as part of the United States government's policy of forcibly relocating Japanese Americans inland from the West Coast, where the nation was gripped by war hysteria after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Arthur C. Beck and Leupp Italian POW Camp Scrapbook includes an Ave Maria song sheet; personal photos of military personnel, Native Americans, camp buildings, Camp Williams in Utah, and Salt Lake City, Utah; postcards from the Grand Canyon, the Navajo Nation, and Meteor Crater; brochures for Meteor Crater and Casa Grande National Monument; an Historical and Geographical Map of Navajo Country 1938 and a map of Navajo Country Arizona, New Mexico and Utah 1933; a book of photos and text Indians of the Southwest, and a few personal notes and descriptions.

The collection is organized as a scrapbook.
