BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Shadwell Bowyer was born in London, England on August 5, 1886. He went to school at the Charter House School in London, and in 1903 he emigrated to Tucson, Arizona. He worked as a cowhand at Oracle, Arizona and in 1910 opened the first automobile house in Tucson. During his early years in Tucson, he operated the Blue Bar Taxi and Transfer Company, the first taxi cab company in that city. Soon after, he ran Tucson's Cadillac Dealership. Bowyer became a citizen in 1915 and joined the U.S. Army. He served overseas as an intelligence officer in France. In 1920 he organized and became president of the Tucson Motor Trades Association. Later, he became president of the Southern Arizona Automobile Dealers' Association and in 1923 he founded Bowyer Motors in Tucson. In 1926, he moved to Phoenix, Arizona to run the Packard Motor Car Company. Three years later he was elected President of the Arizona Automobile Dealer's Association. During the 1920s he began selling American La France fire engines. In 1933 he began expanding his professional activities to include national groups. During the 1940s he served as Administrator of the Phoenix War Transportation Committee. During the 1950s and 1960s he sold Mercedes Benz automobiles. His wife's name was Gladys and they had two children, Robert H. and Elizabeth Anne.

Bowyer served on the Tucson City Council and as Director of the Southwestern Bankhead Highway Association. He also became a charter member of the Tucson Rotary club and Director of the Tucson Chamber of Commerce as well as the Phoenix Chamber of Commerce. He was a life member of the Arizona Polo Association and served as president of the Phoenix Rotary Club.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers document Bowyer's personal and professional activities in both Phoenix and Tucson from 1920 until the 1970s. The papers also document the activities of the Phoenix and Tucson Rotary Clubs and Bowyer's involvement with those organization. The collection lacks documents relating to Bowyer's involvement with the professional associations mentioned in the biographical note. Bowyer's involvement in sports activities, the army, with other car dealerships and the Phoenix Country club are also documented.
