Collection includes letter signed by Louis Hughes pardoning Brown for a contempt charge in 1893.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Brown, newspaperman, was a civil war veteran who arrived in Tucson in 1873. He was editor of the *Arizona Enterprise* and *Tucson Citizen*. In 1893, Brown was sent to the Arizona Territorial Prison in Yuma on a contempt charge. He served on the committee for the Chicago World's Fair and Colombian Exhibition in 1893. He also served as circulation manager of the *Arizona Daily Star* until 1907.
