MS 1198 Fenster School Collection 1932-1983

DESCRIPTION

The collection contains correspondence, publications, scrapbooks and photographs from three Tucson private boarding schools that were located in the Sabino Canyon area during the mid-20th century. The bulk of the material is from Southern Arizona School for Boys, and, to a lesser extent, materials from Fenster Ranch School and Valley School for Girls.

HISTORICAL NOTE

George and Kitty Fenster came to Tucson from New York with their two children, Kenneth and Beverly, in 1941 in search of a more accommodating climate for George's rheumatoid arthritis. George held a job as a civilian accountant, while Kitty worked as a substitute teacher for Tucson Unified School District. In 1944 the two established their own private, coeducational boarding school for children with health problems.

Although only one student attended the inaugural year, Fenster Ranch School grew until it was accepting students from all over the nation and the world. Southwestern artist Ted DeGrazia painted murals and taught art there before he became well-known. In 1965 the Fensters relinquished ownership of the school and it became a non-profit corporation, although the Fenster family continued their involvement as members of the Board of Directors. The school's title was shortened to "Fenster School," as the "Ranch" designation no longer applied due to urban sprawl. In 1974 the school relocated its headquarters to the former site of another private boarding school, Southern Arizona School for Boys (S.A.S.), which had closed the previous year. Fenster incorporated students from S.A.S. and the nearby Valley School for Girls.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Although the collection is associated by name with the Fenster School, most of the materials it contains are from the Southern Arizona School for Boys, which closed in 1973 after a fire. Much of the alumni and correspondence is addressed to Mrs. John Walsh, the S.A.S. alumni secretary. Notable S.A.S. figures include Captain and Mrs. Faigrieve, the headmaster of S.A.S. and his wife; S.A.S. teachers such as Mr. Felty, Mr. Ormsby, and Mr. Everitt; and Mr. Whitcombe, headmaster of the neighboring Valley School for Girls.

The collection contains many news clippings related to S.A.S., Fenster, Valley School, and the numerous other private schools that flourished in Tucson during the 1930s-1950s. Also present are several student-run publications from S.A.S., as well as nearly every issue of "The Spur," the school's official newsletter, from 1939-1970.

The scrapbooks contain mostly news clippings and S.A.S. sample applications, report cards, etc. Most of the photographs and albums are undated, although Album 1 contains S.A.S. graduation photos from 1932-1971. The remainder of the photographs depict S.A.S. students both on and off campus, hiking and exploring the Sabino Canyon area, and numerous equestrian and polo scenes.

In addition to the S.A.S. materials, news articles and advertisements for Fenster School and Valley School for Girls are also included, as well as other Tucson area private schools such as Brandes, Treehaven, and Arizona Sunshine School.
