Arizona Historical Society

The **Arizona Historical Society (AHS)** was established by an act of the First Territorial Legislature in 1864. It is Arizona's oldest historical agency.

The AHS is a nonprofit state agency whose mission is to collect, preserve, interpret and disseminate the history of Arizona and the West.

AHS statewide headquarters and its Southern Division, called the **Arizona History Museum**, are both located at 949 East 2nd Street, Tucson AZ; telephone 520/628-5774.

Tucson's Southern Division is an affiliate of the Smithsonian Institution and is accredited by the American Association of Museums.

Library/archive material is non-circulating and is available for research; hours differ from museum hours and vary according to staff availability. Call 520/628-5774 to check on hours or for special access.

Arizona Mercantile Store

The Museum's Arizona Mercantile Store hours vary, according to volunteer availability.

Museum Patron Parking

Free parking for patrons is located in the garage at the northeast corner of East 2nd Street and North Euclid Avenue. Use the East 2nd Street entrance.

Additional AHS Southern Division Museums in Tucson include:

Fort Lowell Museum

The Fort Lowell Museum is at 2900 North Craycroft Road in Tucson's Fort Lowell Park. It offers visitors a view of life on an 1880's military post with changing exhibits and special programs.

Downtown History Museum

The **Downtown History Museum**, in the Wells Fargo Bank building at 140 North Stone Avenue, presents "History in the Heart of Tucson" exhibits.

Admission to all AHS Museums statewide is FREE to AHS members; non-members are charged a nominal entrance fee.
