The Arizona Historical Society is soliciting demonstrators for the 2016 HERITAGE FESTIVAL at Pioneer Museum to be held October 8 in Flagstaff from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Heritage Festival is a long-running tradition hosted by Pioneer Museum. For one day each year attendees are immersed in arts and crafts typical of long ago while being inspired by their application to modern, everyday life.

We are looking for individuals and groups interested in demonstrating traditional crafts (such as knife making, pottery, candle dipping, and others). In exchange for a demonstration, individuals and groups are encouraged to sell handmade goods, as long as the goods are directly related to the demonstration. Arizona Historical Society will not charge a fee for selling these goods.

In addition, we are looking for craftspeople/artisans interested in teaching workshops in the future on the grounds of Pioneer Museum. We will have a sign-up sheet available during this year's Festival and will provide coordination for planning and scheduling workshops.
