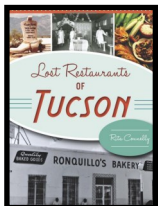

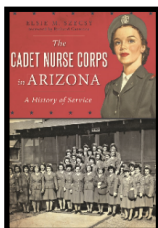
July 1st, 6:00pm: Book Signing and Discussion with Rita Connelly
