Lalo Guerrero

The Father of Chicano Music

Eduardo “Lalo” Guerrero, Jr. was born in Tucson’s Barrio Viejo on Christmas Eve, 1916. The Father of Chicano music, [Lalo Guerrero](#) was the first artist to wed Spanish-language lyrics and slang to swing and R&B, creating a bilingual boogie-woogie sound that articulated and illuminated the Latino experience in 20th century America. Come and practice your rumba moves to the beat of Lalo’s music!
