#### Little-Known Lore From 1692 to Date

Creator and project designer of the amazing USS Arizona Mall Memorial on the University of Arizona campus, David Carter joins us for "San Xavier del Bac: Little-Known Lore From 1692 to Date."

A designer/builder for 28 years, David worked on adobe residential rentals and historic renovation, primarily in Tucson's Barrio Libre. Editor of San Xavier del Bac: Portrait of a Desert Church by Bernard L. Fontana, he has also served the community as the Secretary of Patronato San Xavier (2007-2016), Sheriff of the Tucson Corral of Westerners, and Tucson Festival Chair. David earned an M.A. with honors in philosophy, politics and economics at Oxford University.

Ever wonder where San Xavier Mission's first church stands today and why? Why today's Tohono O'odham likely avoided smallpox? Or how and why Tumacácori's statues came to San Xavier? Discover the answers to these and many other related questions and enjoy some of the earliest photographs of Arizona's iconic church. In addition, David will share the details of his unique December 2013 discovery above a church window.

## HIDDEN TUCSON II Tour

On the crisp morning of April 8th, twenty-six enthusiastic folks boarded a Bee Line Coach for a Pathfinders' Hidden Tucson II excursion. Such a tour travels to somewhat out-of-the-way places in Tucson where it certainly can be more interesting and fun to go with a group than by oneself.

Our first stop was at Medicine Man Gallery on East Sunrise Drive. Here we viewed on display countless interesting pieces of history.

These included beautiful ancient Indian pottery, Indian blankets and jewelry. One of the lovely old pottery pieces was made by a member of the Zuni tribe circa 1865! We were fortunate to have our own historian Pathfinders'





member Jerry Freund share his extensive knowledge and stories of these treasures. At the gallery an entire room is devoted to well-known western artist Maynard Dixon.

The next stop was at Tucson Medical Center where again our own Pathfinders' member Jerry Freund shared the interesting history of Desert San (Sanatorium). This was a forerunner of the Tucson Medical Center.

Another name for the disease was White



Plague. At Desert San tubercular patients were put through the cure by controlled sunlight. By 1943 Tucson Medical Center was coming into view.

At noon our group was welcomed for lunch at Tohono Chul Park, a desert oasis in northwest Tucson. After a delicious lunch in the patio, we were divided into two groups and enjoyed guided tours of the park with friendly and knowledgeable docents.

The Geology Wall is one of the outstanding exhibits at Tohono Chul. This wall exemplifies the ancient geologic history of the nearby looming Santa Catalina Mountains.



After a day of viewing, learning and socializing, we were returned to the Arizona History Museum at 4:30pm by our friendly and competent driver, Jack Burns.
