DESCRIPTION

Four folders reflect enlistment and discharge forms, records of personal clothing issue, and meeting notes of Company F (of Tucson) on July 18, 1898. The enlistment and discharge forms are blank. The meeting notes of Company F reflect the election of officers for the unit. Personal clothing and equipment issued for individuals of Company F are contained in the ledger for the period 1896 through 1898.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Individual companies of the Arizona National Guard faced many difficulties during the later portion of the 19th century. With little funding or support from state or federal sources military organizations found it difficult to recruit, train, and equip members. What equipment or clothing was available usually consisted of items displaced from the regular Army. Units were allowed to elect their own company level officers with senior officers appointed by the state governor or elected by the commissioned officers of the Regiment.
