DESCRIPTION

This collection entails one manuscript and 35mm slides associated with Maurice Cook's visit to Arizona in 1970. Images show desert vegetation, buildings, street scenes, and desert landscape in Tucson, Phoenix, Scottsdale, Tempe, and Superior, Arizona. Thirteen slides show Sabino Canyon with visitor center, roadways, hills, and hikers. Nine slides document Cook's drive up Mt. Lemmon from the north side.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Maurice B. Cook was born in Minneapolis, MN and graduated from the University of Illinois in 1941. Trained as an electrical engineer Cook served with the U.S. Army Signal Corps during World War II and later was the chief engineer on many architectural and engineering projects in the United States and Europe. He designed systems for Chicago's McCormick Place Exhibition Hall, the Chicago Subway, and many of his blueprints are housed in the Smithsonian and Library of Congress collections. Cook's interest in photography started with a Brownie camera in 1927. Working on an engineering project in Phoenix, AZ Cook photographed various southern Arizona locations during his time here.
