## MS 0640 Pack family Papers, 1864-1953

## DESCRIPTION

This collection of diaries, military papers, manuscripts, correspondence and photographs was assembled and/or created by Arthur N. Pack, Charles L. Pack, and George W. Pack. It relates events and daily life of Arthur Pack, his father Charles L. Pack, mother Alice Hatch Pack, and grandfather George W. Pack. The time period of the documents relating to Arthur Pack is 1908 - 1953. Charles Pack's papers date from 1871 - 1930, Alice Hatch Pack's from 1879 - 1885, and 1917. George Pack's papers date from 1864 - 1904.

## **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Arthur Newton Pack was born February 20<sup>th</sup>, 1893, in Cleveland, Ohio. He attended the Adirondack-Florida School in Pine Grove, Florida, until 1910. He continued his education at Williams College in Massachusetts. In 1915 Arthur graduated from the Harvard Graduate School of Business Administration. After graduation, he worked as an aide in the United States Ordnance Department in Washington D.C. During World War I, he was stationed in England as a first lieutenant in the Ordnance Department, and just as he was being discharged in 1919, he was promoted to captain. He married Eleanor "Brownie" Brown in 1919. They had three children; Eleanor, Vernon and Margaret.

Arthur and his father, Charles, founded the American Nature Association of Washington D.C. He also persuaded his father to found the 'Charles Lathrop Pack Forestry Foundation', which would later be instrumental in funding the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum.

Some years after Eleanor Brown left him, he married Phoebe Katherine Finley in 1936. They had two children, Charles Lathrop Pack II, and Phoebe Irene. He bought a ranch in northern New Mexico which he called Ghost Ranch. He wrote two books about the ranch, his autobiography, <u>We Called it Ghost Ranch</u>, and <u>The Ghost Ranch Story</u>. In 1955, three children; Eleanor, Vernon and Margaret.

Arthur and his father, Charles, founded the American Nature Association of Washington D.C. He also persuaded his father to found the 'Charles Lathrop Pack Forestry Foundation', which would later be instrumental in funding the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum.

Some years after Eleanor Brown left him, he married Phoebe Katherine Finley in 1936. They had two children, Charles Lathrop Pack II, and Phoebe Irene. He bought a ranch in northern New Mexico which he called Ghost Ranch. He wrote two books about the ranch, his autobiography, <u>We Called it Ghost Ranch</u>, and <u>The Ghost Ranch Story</u>. In 1955, he presented his ranch to the Board of Christian Education Presbyterian Church, USA, to be used as a national retreat and education center.

In 1941 he began building Ghost Ranch Lodge, in Tucson, Arizona. In 1946 he moved there permanently, though they still spent summers at Ghost Ranch in New Mexico. In 1952 he was named 'Man of the Year' in Tucson. He and an old friend, William Carr, co-founded the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum in 1952. The museum was made possible by a generous donation from the 'Charles Lathrop Pack Forestry Foundation'. Arthur was the first president of the museum. He also became very active in Tucson, and was president or chairman of many national and local organizations. In 1972 he established a one million dollar trust fund for St. Mary's Hospital. He died December 6<sup>th</sup>, 1975. At the time of his death, he had contributed over \$500,000 to the development of the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum. At that time it was listed as among the ten best zoos in the world.

Arthur's father, Charles Lathrop Pack was born May 7<sup>th</sup>, 1857 in Lexington, Michigan. He was educated in public schools, and attended Brook Schlater in Cleveland, Ohio. He became a renowned forestry expert and conservationist. He won national recognition for his work in forestry. He continued to add to the family fortune with their lumber business, and eventually became one of the largest manufacturers of lumber in the United States. During World War I, he coordinated the 'War Garden' effort, and published a book illustrating war gardens called <u>The War Garden</u> <u>Victorious</u>. He was a prominent figure in Cleveland, establishing the Cleveland Trust Company as well as donating many thousands of dollars to local causes. In 1886 he married Alice Hatch . They had three children; Randolph, Arthur and Beulah. In 1907 he was appointed by President Theodore Roosevelt to his National Conservation Committee. He eventually moved to Lakewood, New Jersey where he lived until his death in 1937. His wife, Alice, continued to reside there until her death in 1950.

Arthur's grandfather, George Willis Pack was born June 6<sup>th</sup>, 1831 to George and Maria Lathrop Pack in Fenner, Madison County, New York. He attended a public school in Peterboro, New York. When he was seventeen, he went to Michigan with his father to clear land for a farm. He went on to a prosperous career as a partner and leader in several lumber companies, harvesting the great pine forests in Michigan. George W. Pack was well respected by the people of Michigan, and in 1864, as their presidential elector, he helped vote Abraham Lincoln into office. In 1854 he married Francis Farman, and they had three children; Charles Lathrop Pack, Mary Pack (married Amos B. McNairy) and Beulah Pack (married Phillip A. Rollins). In 1885 he moved to Asheville, North Carolina, due to his wife's health, where he lived until his death on August 30<sup>th</sup>, 1906.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Pack Family Collection (2.5 ft.) consists of four boxes, one oversized, arranged into 8 series: (1) Arthur Pack Diaries 1908 - 1953; (2) Correspondence 1910 - 1918; (3) Military Papers 1917 - 1919; (4) Miscellaneous; (5) Charles Pack papers 1871 - 1927; (6) Alice Hatch Pack papers 1879 - 1885, 1917; (7) George W. Pack papers, 1801, 1864 - 1904; (8) Pack Family photographs.

A large portion of this collection consists of diaries. Arthur Pack's diaries relate to his day to day activities when he was in high school, college, and the military. Arthur Pack cofounded the Arizona Sonora Desert Museum, and there is mention of it in his five year diary. Both Charles Pack's and Alice Hatch Pack's diaries are accounts of their visits to Europe dated before their marriage. The rest of the collection is various papers, correspondence and awards.

Series One, Arthur Pack's diaries 1908 - 1953, contains twenty five diaries dated from 1908 - 1919 which relates his daily life in high school, college, and the military. His five year diary, dated 1949 - 1953 relates his daily activities in Tucson, operating his guest ranch and his growing civic involvement. It contains brief mentions of the establishment of the Desert Museum.

Series Two, Correspondence 1910 - 1918, consists of six letters ranging from his school days to his two year post in the military.

Series Three, Military papers 1917 - 1919, is comprised of letters, orders, papers and blueprints pertaining to his career in the Ordnance Department, United States military in France and England during World War One.

Series Four, Miscellaneous, contains a special edition of the book, <u>We Called It Ghost Ranch</u> signed by Arthur Pack to Bill Carr, cofounder of the Desert Museum. There is also a manila envelope labelled "Prizes won by pigeons - early 1900s" which contains red and blue ribbons from 1907 - 1908 Cleveland Fanciers Club Show, 1901 Pan American Exposition, Buffalo, N.Y., and 1903, 1906 and 1907 - National Fancier's and Breeder's Association, Chicago, Ill.

Series Five, Charles Pack papers, consists of Charles Pack's papers, including two oversized items. There is a notebook/scrapbook of school work by Charles, four travel diaries of trips to Europe, 1874 - 1878, political papers, awards, correspondence and two poems to Charles on his 51<sup>st</sup> birthday from family members. One of the oversized items is a scrapbook of letters from dignitaries world-wide acknowledging receipt of <u>The War Garden Victorious</u> by Charles Pack. The other is Arthur Pack's certificate of commission into the "Officer Reserve Corps of the Army of the United States" as 1<sup>st</sup> lieutenant in the Ordnance Department.

Series Six, Alice Hatch Pack papers, contains four of Alice Hatch Pack's travel diaries about trips to Europe, Egypt and England from 1879 - 1885, before she married Charles Pack. There is also a letter to Arthur dated 1917 congratulating him on his military appointment.

Series Seven, George Pack papers, consists of a biographical book, correspondence, news clippings, and political certificates. There is also a letter that was found with his papers dated 1801 from Edwin Fort to William Young.

Series Eight, Pack Family photographs, consists of photographs of and relating to the Pack Family. It contains pictures of Arthur as a baby, a child of three years, and as an adult. There are also pictures of his father, Charles, his mother, Alice, his older brother, Randolph, his grandfather, George, and grandmother, Frances with his papers dated 1801 from Edwin Fort to William Young.

Series Eight, Pack Family photographs, consists of photographs of and relating to the Pack Family. It contains pictures of Arthur as a baby, a child of three years, and as an adult. There are also pictures of his father, Charles, his mother, Alice, his older brother, Randolph, his grandfather, George, and grandmother, Frances Farman Pack.
