HISTORICAL NOTE

Rotary International was started in Chicago in 1905 for business and professional men who wanted to recapture the small-town friendliness sometimes lost in a big city. Phoenix Rotary Club No. 100 was granted its charter on March 1, 1914. The previous June, Wallace C. Button met Mr. L. P. Sullivan from San Antonio, Texas, while on his way home from a stationery convention. Sullivan was very enthusiastic about the Rotary club he had joined (No. 52) and gave Button an address of his club's founder, Herbert J. Hayes. After receiving information, Button passed it around to several of his friends. The first organizational meeting was called in August but the first business meeting was not held until Dec. 15, 1913. Twenty-five men met that night but no decision about the formation of the club was made. Some feared it would cause undue competition with the newly formed Chamber of Commerce.

On January 5, 1914, fifty men met and approved the constitution and by-laws for the club along with several amendments. Amos Betts was elected to be the first president of the club. Other officers were elected for the remainder of the fiscal year and the application process to Rotary International was begun. Thirty men paid the \$10 and became charter members of the group. According to Charles Munger, the chronologist and statistician for Club #100, two factors held up the club's application. First, they wanted the designation of Club No. 100 and had to wait for other clubs to be accepted. Second, the international association had ruled previously that no Rotary club would be established in cities with populations less than 25,000. The members of the club argued that as the state capital as well as the financial and social center of the state, Phoenix could fill all of the classifications represented in cities of 100,000. The charter was granted on March 1, 1914, and the members received word on March 30, 1914. Club 100 became the first Rotary Club in Arizona and from it all other Arizona clubs received their start.

On September 26, 1914, the Arizona Gazette ran a ten page special edition to introduce Rotary and its then 70 members to the community. This edition is displayed in plastic and is part of the Phoenix Rotary Club Records. The Rotary Smile began publishing in September 1914. In 1918 the newsletter was renamed the *Rotarizonian* and has been published with only two brief stops since that time. The first club roster was issued in July 1915, and the first ladies' night was held March 12, 1914.

Over the years the Phoenix Rotary Club has also been involved in the Roosevelt Council Boy Scouts, the Arizona Boy's Ranch, the Phoenix Rotary Mutt Show, high school student clubs and many other civic and charitable projects. By 1994, Rotary Club 100 had reached about 300 members and yet today remains an active participant in the life of Phoenix.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

The Phoenix Rotary Club Records are arranged in 6 series:

Series 1. Board Minutes, 1916-1971. 1 foot 8 inches. 32 folders.

This series consists of chronologically arranged, bound board minutes from the Phoenix Rotary Club Executive Board. It also contains the Service Report of 1943-1944.

Series 2. Member Files, 1915-1995. 1 foot 8 inches. 54 folders.

This series consists of alphabetically arranged past presidents' files and member files.

Series 3. Club Rosters, 1918-1981. 12 inches. 13 folders.

This series consists of chronologically-arranged club rosters featuring photos and biographical information about each member.

Series 4. Photographs 1920-1983. 14 1/2 inches. 45 folders.

The photographs in this collection are arranged in the same order as the series. Most are from member files and scrapbooks. Others were from a general photo folder including oversized photos.

Series 5. Scrapbooks, 1964-1968. 3 1/2 inches. 5 folders.

This series consists of the materials from three Rotary scrapbooks. One was a general club scrapbook from 1967. Another celebrated the 50th birthday of the Phoenix Rotary Club #100, and the third contains the newspaper from the start of the Phoenix chapter in 1914. They have all been digitized in context and photos have been filed separately. Oversized items are also stored separately.

Series 6. Realia, 1 inches.

This series is made up of one artifact, a Phoenix Rotary Club #100 banner.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The records document the Phoenix Rotary Club

Series 1. Board Minutes, 1916-1971.

These minutes are from the weekly executive board meetings. They contain the voting record of the board of executives and gives reports on the different activities of the committees. Minutes from lunch meetings were included in the earlier minutes. This series also contains the Service Report of 1943-1944.

Series 2. Member Files, 1915-1995.

This series divides into two subseries: past presidents files and general member files. The folders contain such things as member information cards, correspondence, biographies, death announcements, attendance and financial records, thank-yous, speeches, committee memos, and other inter- and intra-club communications

Series 3. Club Rosters, 1918-1982.

This series consists of club rosters featuring photos and information about each member such as classification of membership, date of membership, birthday, wife's name, and address.

Series 4. Photographs 1920-1983.

The photographs in this collection are arranged in the same order as the series in general. Most are from member files and scrapbooks. Some were from a general photo folder and others were and still are stored together as over-sized photos at the end of the member folders' photos. A majority of the photos are portraits of members. Some events such as the Phoenix Rotary Mutt Show, the 50th anniversary celebration, and Game Night in 1967 are well represented in the collection.

Series 5. Scrapbooks, 1964-1968.

This series consists of the materials from three Rotary scrapbooks. One was a general scrapbook featuring photos from Christmas, the Phoenix Rotary Mutt Show, and Game Night all in 1967. Another scrapbook celebrated the 50th birthday of the Phoenix Rotary Club #100 and includes photos from the Golden Anniversary banquet, candids from the year, member photos for 1963-64, and memorabilia from the anniversary year. The third scrapbook contains the 1914 Arizona Gazette honoring the new Phoenix chapter.

The scrapbooks have all been digitized in context and photos have been filed separately. Black and white copies of the digitized images are in the scrapbook folders. Color images are available on the computer. The photos from the membership pages in the anniversary scrapbook have been labeled with name and location number on the back. Numbers start with the first page of membership pages and photos are numbered by row and column, from top to bottom, left to right. The graphics from these pages have been cut out and saved in the scrapbook folders. The 50th anniversary commemorative issue of *The Arizona Republic Days and Ways* magazine has been stored in a box for oversized documents.

Series 6. Realia.

Phoenix Rotary Club #100 banner. This is a white banner with yellow and blue printing. The banner features a saguaro and a sunrise over the mountains in the middle of the banner. It reads, "Phoenix Rotary Club No. 100, Phoenix, Arizona, U.S.A., 'In the Valley of the Sun.'" 7x10. It has yellow fringe on the bottom.

PROVENANCE

The collection was donated by the Phoenix Rotary Club #100 in 1998.

RESTRICTIONS

This collection has no restrictions.

Permission to publish material from the Phoenix Rotary Club Records, 1914-1995, must be obtained from the Library and Archives Department at the Central Arizona Division of the Arizona Historical Society.

NOTES TO RESEARCHERS

Newspaper clippings were photocopied onto acid-neutral paper in order to preserve the other items in the collection. Due to the fragility of the scrapbooks, each page was photographed with a digital camera and the page context was recorded before elements were separated into photograph and memorabilia folders. Information found in member and photograph files were in no apparent order when they came in and remain in that same order yet. The member files were placed in alphabetical order to help facilitate research.
