# MS 1327 St. Elizabeth of Hungary Auxiliary Collection 1962 - 1983

#### DESCRIPTION

This collection consists of a series of scrapbooks highlighting the activities of the St. Elizabeth of Hungary clinic and its Auxiliary volunteers between the years 1962 and 1983. The scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings, photos, correspondence, programs, and newsletters detailing the fundraising events organized by the Auxiliary volunteers on behalf of the clinic, as well as the important events in the lives of the sisters who ran the clinic. The newspaper clippings provide an overview of the history of the clinic and its place in the Tucson community, as well as providing insight into the workings of non-profit clinics in general. Of particular interest among the clippings are descriptions of some of the events, such as the "Sound of Music" movie premiere, held as a St. Elizabeth's fundraiser at the Catalina Cinema. The photos provide a roster of the members of the Auxiliary committee and the administrative staff of the clinic, as well as the elderly attendees of the clinic's social events. The correspondence mostly consists of appreciation letters or responses to invitations and provides a listing of prominent Tucsonans who attended clinic benefit events, such as former mayors of Tucson. The programs detail the organizers of the events, and illustrate the variety of events the produced. The newsletters describe the day to day running of the Auxiliary committee and provide insight on their public relations with potential donors.

#### HISTORICAL NOTE

The St. Elizabeth of Hungary was founded in 1961 by the Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Tucson and run by the Sisters of Our Lady of Victory. Its mission is to provide medical and dental care to those who are unable to pay for these services and who do not qualify for public health care, the majority of whom are elderly and homebound. The clinic is entirely run by volunteers.

The St. Elizabeth of Hungary Auxiliary is the branch of volunteers primarily concerned with organizing public relations events for the clinic, such as auctions and sales for fundraising and social events for the elderly under the clinic's care.
