The Tucson Rimers was founded by Jennie G. Fowler, ca. 1928. Its purpose was to create a general interest in poetry and promote the Arizona Poetry Society. The group awarded monetary prizes to university students and contributed to a column in the Tucson Citizen newspaper entitled "With the Verse Makers of Arizona."
