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MS 846 Twin Buttes Mining and Railroad Records 1905 - 1931

DESCRIPTION

This collection consists of records associated with four enterprises in the Twin Buttes Arizona area from 1905 to 1931. Three efforts were organized around the various copper mines and include the Twin Buttes Mining & Smelting Company, the Twin Buttes Railroad Company, and the Midland Copper Company. In addition to the mining materials there are several folders associated with the Twin Buttes Post Office including postal forms, registration receipt book, and a money order register from 1917 to 1925. Mining company forms, catalogs for mining equipment, and articles of organization are present for the Twin Buttes Mining & Smelting Co. The Twin Buttes Railroad Company materials consist of many forms used in the operation of the railroad, a worker's time log with names, and one folder of passenger and freight rates.

One account ledger for accounts of the Twin Buttes Railroad from August 1906 to October 1910. The accounts from 1906 through June 1910 show freight accounts, ticket sales, supplies and expenses for the railroad. The ledger for July through October 1910 appears to show accounts for a general store, showing sundries and groceries. It is probable that the second part of the ledger is for a company store in Twin Buttes.

HISTORICAL NOTE

The mines of the Twin Buttes area are part of the Pima Mining District, 28 miles south of Tucson, AZ. The first mining claims in the area date back to around 1876 however little significant production was done before 1905. In that year D. S. Rose of Milwaukee organized the Twin Buttes Mining & Smelting Co. and acquired many of the promising claims in the area. This company built a 28-mile railroad from the Twin Buttes area to Tucson and established a smelter for its ore near the Santa Cruz River. Midland Copper Company took over many of the mines previously controlled by Twin Buttes Mining & Smelting Company in 1917 with leases and purchases. Both companies continued to produce ore until 1948 when William Foy of Twin Buttes gained control of much of the mining interests.

ACQUISITION – Records were Donated by Owen P. and John H. Watts who found the materials while rock hunting in May 1959. Donation of railroad ledger (previously MS 943) is unknown.

ACCESS - There are no restrictions on access to this collection.

PROCESSING - The collection was previously processed and reviewed by Dave Tackenberg in April 2010. In 2015, MS 943 – Twin Buttes Railroad Ledger was integrated into this collection.
