#### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Wood, a manufacturer and author from Dayton, Ohio retired to Tucson in 1923 where he pursued interests in writing, western history, and book collecting. At the time of his death in 1927, he was gathering material for a history of the Apache Indians.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection documents the writings of Charles Morgan Wood, retired manufacturer and author. Includes personal manuscripts by various authors on subjects such as "The Murder

at Oatman Flat," "The Last Apache Raid at Empire Ranch," "Arizona Argonauts," and "Revised Outlines and Descriptions of Military Posts and Stations in Arizona, Feb. 1, 1872." Also includes interviews with early settlers in the southwest region, mainly southern Arizona. This collection also includes a scrapbook of general news clippings on western history. The collection would be useful to researchers of Arizona pioneers and the Apache wars in Arizona.
