Biographical Note

Jack Fuss was born in Philadelphia, PA, January 7, 1893. He arrived in Flagstaff, AZ in 1918. Fuss was Game Warden for the Grand Canyon region during the infamous "Deer Drive" of 1924. He is best known as the originator of the Flagstaff All Indian Pow-wow, as well as for his commercial art, mostly billboards and advertising signs.
