BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

James Warren LeSueur, Mormon pioneer, was born in Idaho in 1878 but came to Arizona as an infant. He operated a general mercantile store from 1906 to 1927. He was an active member of the LDS Church and was president of the Maricopa Stake from 1912 to 1926. He died in Mesa in 1948.
