BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: William N Miller was born in California in 1860. He arrived in Arizona in 1878. He started driving a stage in 1879 from Tucson to the Cienega to Tres Alamos to Point of Mountains. He remained in Arizona until 1883. His reminiscences describe life in Tombstone, Tucson, and Charleston and he mentions many prominent citizens of those towns. After leaving Arizona, he lived in New Mexico, Nevada and Idaho and seems to have settled in Idaho. It is not known when he died.

SCOPE AND CONTENT: This collection of reminiscences written in the form of correspondence from William N. Miller to Mrs. Kitt of the Arizona Historical Society. There is a series of nine letters written between 1930 and 1936 wherein he describes his life. The collection includes transcripts done at that time. The reminiscences describe Tombstone, Geronimo, “Negro troops” in Arizona, Charleston and the Copper Creek Mines.
