Sancy Nason Collection
1960 - 1964****DESCRIPTION**

This collection entails two scrapbooks, photographs, and a school year book belonging to Sancy Nason of Tucson, AZ. The scrapbooks reflect the period when Sancy was a student at Amphi Junior High and Senior High and highlights her experiences and activities.

Scrapbook #1 has a graduation program listing Sancy from Amphi Junior High dated 1960 and many magazine clippings featuring animals and travel locations including images of Westward Look Resort of Tucson. Scrapbook #2 entails materials from 1963 and 1964 while Sancy was in high school at Amphi. Invitations to symphony and drama performances, two issues of the school newspaper "Desert Gazette," and announcements of school activities highlight Sancy's experiences and activities. Both scrapbooks were heavily damaged with many items loose or falling out. These materials have been gathered and placed in folders reflecting loose items from the respective scrapbooks. The school yearbook is the "Panther Trails" from Amphitheater High School for 1963 and has many salutations to Sancy from her friends. Approximately 30 photographs in folder 4 highlight a family trip to Niagara Falls in 1964 and several show school images. Oversized items entail one cartoon drawing titled "Karate Kai" and one certificate for Lt. Richard G. Daggett for crossing the Equator as a member of the USS Midway in 1972.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Sancy Nason was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Nason who lived on Canyon Road in Tucson. During the period of this collection Sancy was enrolled at Amphitheatre Junior High and Senior High in Tucson Arizona. She was active in many school functions and activities and appears to have had many friends. The school yearbook for 1963 when Sancy was a Junior lists her as involved with Y-Sponsored Clubs, the "Teen Press Editor" for the *Arizona Daily Star*, participant in the Arizona Model United Nations General Assembly program, and the Foreign Language Club. Scrapbook #2 contains two letters seeking her admission to the University of California at Berkley and Smith College in Massachusetts due to her exceptional academic standing. It is unclear if she attended either of these schools.
