HISTORICAL NOTE: P.A.WS. was founded in September, 1988 by Bobbie Holaday as an Arizona based, grassroots, non-profit coalition dedicated to preserving the Mexican Wolf and supporting reintroduction plans. Members wrote letters to lobby agencies and members of congress to support legislation and programs to protect and preserve wolves. Holaday, along with P.A.WS., worked closely with Terry Johnson of Arizona Game and Fish, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services, Bruce Babbitt, U.S. Secretary of the Interior, the Phoenix Zoo, and many other agencies and organizations. P.A.WS. operated with a mission focused on collaboration and compromise to ensure the reintroduction program was a success. Holaday, representing P.A.WS., formed a task force and held hearings to facilitate dialogue among stakeholders including the livestock and timber industries, environmental and recreational groups, as well as various business interests.

P.A.WS. promoted education about wolves for adults and children. By 1997 the group had conducted or participated in over 500 educational presentations and workshops for schools, civic groups, non-profit organizations, and state agencies and institutions.

The first official wolf release was made January 26, 1998 in Alpine, Arizona. By this time, membership had grown to over 500 members in the United States and twenty other countries. Holaday disbanded P.A.WS. in August 1998 believing field biologists and law enforcement were better positioned to sustain the program.

**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:** Bobbie Holaday was a wilderness advocate well before the Mexican gray wolf project and was responsible for the wilderness designation of Hells Gate and Eagletail Mountains in Arizona. From there, her interest and knowledge in the preservation of the Arizona wilderness grew. Holaday took classes on the environment at

Arizona State University and went on to organize the citizen effort behind the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services and Arizona Game and Fish Department's program to reintroduce the Mexican Gray Wolf by founding P.A.WS.

In recognition of her work, Holaday received a Volunteer Service Award from the Arizona Heritage Alliance in 1994. A year later, she was named Environmentalist of the Year by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission. She received the Defenders of Wildlife's Conservation Award for Excellence in 1998.

**SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE:** Original order reflected within series. Consists of various documents, articles, and photos compiled by Bobbie Holaday chronicling her work with the P.A.WS. while collaborating with many organizations to reintroduce the Mexican gray wolf into the wild.

A combination of various professional materials, this collection has been organized into seven series: Series I: Organization; Series II: Education and Outreach; Series III: Publications; Series IV: Mexican Wolf Blue Range Reintroduction Project; Series V: Scrapbooks; VI: VHS Cassettes; Series VII: Memorabilia

**Series I: Organization** is arranged according to original order which is primarily chronological. It includes plans for the symposium held by P.A.WS. in 1990, newsletters, publications, ephemera, and correspondence. Along with the symposium, events referenced include National Wolf Awareness Week and workshops.

**Series II: Education and Outreach** contains reference lists, fact sheets, teacher's guides, slide presentations, cassettes, notes, and workshop information. The slide presentations were created by Dr. Carol Cochran, curator of education at the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum, contracted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services and used extensively by P.A.WS in their outreach efforts.

**Series III: Publications** organized alphabetically and chronologically. This series contains the newsletters, updates, and official reports Holaday collected from various government and private organizations involved in the wolf reintroduction.

**Series IV: Mexican Wolf Blue Range Reintroduction Project** was the official name given to the final project by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services. This series contains the final draft of the collaborative *Five Year Review* report to the U.S.F.W.S. It prepared by the Mexican Wolf Blue Range Adaptive Management Oversight Committee and Interagency Field Team. The series also includes reports and assessments in preparation of the review, team meeting notes, press releases, budgets, and interagency guides, discussions, and standard operating procedures.

**Series V: Scrapbooks** contains items which were removed from their acetate enclosures but reflect the original order in which they appeared in three ring notebooks and photo

albums. Contains background, clippings, ephemera, publications, correspondence, and photos documenting the years spent reintroducing the Mexican gray wolf into the wild.

**Series VI: VHS cassettes** is arranged alphabetically and includes recordings of television segments, the *Arizona Wolf Symposium* speakers, educational videos, recordings of government/public hearings, wolf release footage, zoo footage, and a P.A.WS. video.

**Series VII: Memorabilia** contains six posters for promotion and education and four t-shirts promoting P.A.WS. and the reintroduction program.
