**DESCRIPTION**

**HISTORICAL NOTE**

The Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers is the senior railway labor union in the United States. It was founded in 1863. In addition to providing representation for its members, the BLE aggressively participates in the labor movement with other unions and organizations in promoting the interests of working men and women and their families. Its goal is to improve the wages, benefits and working conditions of railroad employees. Division #28 in Tucson was established in March 1881 immediately after the arrival of the Southern Pacific Railroad arrived in Tucson.
