Hochderffer, George, 1863-1955

DESCRIPTION

Photographs of Flagstaff buildings, Fire Department, lumbermen and a 1906 Fourth of July celebration. There are photographs of Watahmogie, a Havasupai Indian leader, the U.S. Army Volunteer Infantry, 1st group of officers, 1898, and the Arizona National Guard formation in Flagstaff and at Camp Perry, Ohio, 1891 to 1903. There is also an invitation to a Women's suffrage event in New York which Hochderffer, a member of the Men's League for Woman's Suffrage, attended. A photograph is present of a Civil War document for furnishing a substitute for war service.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Pioneer rancher, farmer, law enforcement officer, and artist in Flagstaff, Arizona; Hochderffer helped organize the Arizona National Guard, Company I. He arrived in Arizona in 1887 and was active in civic affairs in Flagstaff. He died in Cottonwood, Arizona in 1955.
