DESCRIPTION

This collection consists of 35mm slides depicting various Native American groups in Arizona visited by Henry J. Keneally II between 1963 and 1972. Images were made in conjunction with visits for medical and health purposes to the tribes. Slides show individual activities on the reservations including construction, weaving, herding, and recreation. Samples of housing both traditional and modern are present. A series of slides show Native Americans in a maternity ward setting. Additional images show Havasupai Falls area and Keneally's party travel to Supi Village.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Henry J. Keneally was born in San Francisco on September 16, 1911. He studied pre-med at the University of San Francisco and graduated in 1949 with a degree in Biology. He worked with Dorothy Nyswander at the University of California at Berkeley in health education. In 1951 he graduated with a master's degree in public health. From 1953 to 1956 he worked for the American Heart Association in Portland, OR. In 1956 Keneally went to work for the Indian Division of the Department of Health Education & Welfare out of Phoenix, AZ with responsibilities in Arizona, California, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah. For 15 years he was an on-site mentor for field training programs sponsored by the University of California and the Indian Health Service. After retirement Keneally worked at the World Health Organization at Geneva, Switzerland on special assignments and programs. Henry Keneally died on December 3, 1989 in Phoenix, AZ.
