DESCRIPTION

This small photo album consists of images associated with a 1907 – 1908 survey in northern Arizona, New Mexico, southern Utah, and Nevada. Images depict members of the party, camp scenes, surveyors taking readings, equipment, and party members in uniform. Additional images show cattle roundups, Navajos at their reservation, saguaros, and desert scenery.

HISTORICAL NOTE

The survey party depicted in these photographs was led by Charles Kinsey of New Jersey. It is uncertain as to what affiliation the party was working for. One picture in the collection identifies the party as belonging to the United States Geological Survey organization. Coordination with U.S.G.S. historian has failed to identify any reference to Kinsey or to any survey conducted in this location or time period by this agency however. It is possible the survey could have been initiated through territorial governments in cooperation with the Dept. of Interior or other governmental agencies.
