DESCRIPTION

Photographs of Krentz family members, the interior and exteriors of their homes, and Winslow, Arizona buildings. There are also images of a 1898 Fourth of July parade and floats, two images of Hopi Indians, a girls basketball team, and a ladies Hearthstone Club gathering. There are also images from a 1903 Territorial Legislators picnic at San Xavier Mission showing legislators leaning against the Mission walls while they eat. Also present are scenes of a train wreck at Angell, Arizona.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Sara Dugan Krentz was born on the ship "Arizona" while coming to America from Ireland; her parents named her Sara Arizona Dugan. She lived in Gallup, New Mexico, then worked in Prescott, Arizona at Gardner store. She was a clerk for the Territorial Legislature in 1903. In 1904, she married Frank Krentz and they moved to Winslow. They moved to Douglas in 1907 and lived there until her death in 1976. Frank Krentz was the son of Julius and Emma Krentz; his sister, Bertha, married Clarence Spellmire.
