DESCRIPTION

Small collection of card prints showing mining and railroad activity in the Clifton-Morenci area between 1883 and 1885. There is an image of men in a boat "Venture" on a river that may be the San Francisco River, the railroad station, the railroad bridge over the San Francisco River, a train engine and one car stopped on a railroad trestle with men posed on it, a railroad tunnel, and other scenic views of the area. There is also one image of Mrs. Navajo Bill and a cart and burro in Deming, New Mexico.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Harry W. Lucas and his partner were photographers in New Mexico and worked in the Clifton, Arizona area between 1883 and 1885. Lucas had been in Yuma about 1880 then went to Silver City, New Mexico. He was in Clifton in 1885 but returned to Silver City in 1886.
