## **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Arthur and Hedie Wormser retired to Tucson in 1950 from Riverside (Chicago) Illinois where they had lived for almost twelve years. They had immigrated to the United States from Germany with their three children in early 1939 to escape Nazi persecution. Arthur was a mechanical engineer and inventor who contributed to the printing industry in both Germany and the United States. Hedie was a homemaker who loved gardening, handcrafts and opening her home to visitors. Arthur died in 1962 and Hedie moved to New York to live with her son, Hans, where she died in 1990.
