HISTORICAL NOTE

A year after they both learned how to fly, Dr. Karl Harris and his wife Marjorie purchased Maddux Aviation, Inc. from Jim Vercellino. Along with the business and a prime location at Sky Harbor Airport, the Harrises also bought the company's seven aircraft. On September 8, 1957, they began instruction at Saguaro Aviation in the former TWA operations building at 2411 Air Lane Way. Saguaro Aviation employed nine people, five of whom were instructors. Marjorie N. Harris was named president and Lester B. Taylor vice president and general manager. Les also served as an instructor throughout his tenure at Saguaro. Clients could earn a private, commercial, instrument, instructor, or multi-engine license through Saguaro Aviation. While most of the company's focus was on instruction, it also offered charter and rental services. The air service was very successful in its first decade. After seven years the company had eleven aircraft and two helicopters and had trained six hundred new pilots. By 1967, in a new facility, Saguaro Aviation was the only Sky Harbor based air service that specialized in flight training rather than aircraft sales. That same year, all of these small companies joined together to form the Sky Harbor Operators Council, Inc. to deal with issues that arose such as outside operators using the air strips and tie downs and general operations regulations for Sky Harbor.

A Hughes helicopter was added to the fleet in 1961. The goal of Saguaro Aviation was to bring reasonably priced helicopter training courses to the valley. They were convinced that helicopter transportation was going to boom in the rapidly growing city. By adding helicopter training into their regular flight training program, they were able to reduce the cost of instruction from \$7500 to \$750 making it a popular new hobby for men and women alike. Besides offering training, Saguaro's helicopters were put to good use. People charted them for golfing outings, and for transportation from the airport to hotels and resorts north of the city. They also helped perform elk surveys, dry out flood-drenched vineyards, erect power line poles, and once even assisted in a transfer of turkeys from one part of Arizona to another.

The records for the company are strong until the end of the 1960s but most of the records stop in 1969. However, scrapbooks continue to show new pilots through 1978. According to a 1976 Phoenix phone book, the address of the company had changed to another location where the mechanical garage had once been. Saguaro Aviation appears in the phone book until 1990-1991 proving it had lasted for more than forty years. Unfortunately none of the records indicate why it ceased operating at that point.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

The Saguaro Aviation Records are arranged in 11 series:

Series 1: Administrative, 1957-1977, 1 foot, 4 1/2 inches, 38 folders

This series consists of the office papers of Saguaro Aviation. Information about aircraft and course offerings, as well as public relations materials, correspondence, and daybooks make up the bulk of this series.

Series 2: Government Publications, 1938-1970, 4 ft. 10 ¹/₂ inches, 61 folders

This series consists of books from Saguaro Aviation that were published by different arms of the government. These books are arranged by branch and then by chronological order. Sources include branches of the military, the Department of Commerce, and the Federal Aviation Agency.

Series 3: Private Publications, 1937-1978, 3 ft. 11 inches, 87 folders

This series is made up of materials published by non-governmental sources. Aircraft companies, large companies specializing in flight training and several foundations and councils were all represented in the Saguaro Aviation collection. The bulk of the material is study guides, handbooks and reference books.

Series 4: Unpublished Resources, 1964-1969, 6 inches, 12 folders

This series consists of anything without publication information including pamphlets, booklets, and exams.

Series 5: Sectional Aeronautical Charts, 1947-1974, 2 inches, 7 folders

This series consists of aeronautical charts or maps for flying in different regions of North America. Different editions of the same map show comparisons over time. Most of the maps are for the Southwestern United States, but a few others venture out beyond the regional borders.

Series 6: Scrapbooks, 1957-1978, 13 ¹/₂ inches, 9 boxes

The scrapbooks maintained by Saguaro Aviation help tell the history of the company through photographs, newsclippings and captions. The first six scrapbooks consist of labeled photos of recipients of licenses. The other four are general information scrapbooks with photos, clippings, invitations, cards, etc. All but the first scrapbook remain in tact as created.

Series 7: Photographs, 1957-1978, 14 inches, 38 folders

The photographs in this series run the whole length of the collection. Photos taken by many sources give an idea of Saguaro Aviation, Sky Harbor Airport and aviation in general at that time.

Series 8: Negatives, 1957-1978, 17 1/2 inches

The negatives in this series correspond with many of the photographs in the scrapbook series. Some of the images in the photograph series also have matching negatives.

Series 9: Slides, 13 inches

The slides in this series run the whole length of the collection. Photos taken by many sources give an idea of Saguaro Aviation, Sky Harbor Airport and aviation in general at that time. Many of these slides were also developed into photographs in the scrapbooks.

Series 10: Media, unknown dates, 6 ¹/₂ inches

This series consists 5 - 16mm tapes and a view finder card of a Cessna aircraft.

Series 11: Realia, 3 inches

This series contains a wooden model and its pewter casting of the Saguaro Aviation logo. It also contains two certificates mounted on wooden plaques, name plates of employees, and a plastic wallet with Saguaro Aviation printed on it.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Series 1: Administrative, 1957-1977

This series is made up from the files of Saguaro Aviation. Aircraft logs, catalogues, correspondence from the City of Phoenix and the Sky Harbor Operator's Association, Inc. start the collection. Accident reports, insurance, certificates, lease information and day books can be found in this series as well. Public relations materials including original art work and published rates ends the series.

Series 2: Government Publications, 1938-1970

The books in this series were all published by different arms of the government and span from pre World War II to the Vietnam era. Materials are included from the Air Force, the Army, Department of Commerce, Federal Aviation Administration, the Navy and the War Department. Various manuals for air craft (including planes and helicopters) repair and flight make up the mass of this series along with exam guides, air traffic control manuals, and information bulletins.

Series 3: Private Publications, 1937-1978

Anything published but not by the government falls in this category. Training series from Fowler and Jeppesen make up the bulk with other smaller training companies and councils. Most of these materials were current during the most active time of operation of Saguaro Aviation. Handbooks from various aircraft companies make up a secondary part of this series.

Series 4: Unpublished Resources, 1964-1969

This series, made up of unofficially published materials gives example of the training available at the time of operation. The materials on helicopter training were developed by Les Taylor for Saguaro Aviation.

Series 5: Sectional Aeronautical Charts, 1947-1974

The maps in this series were used by pilots to chart flight routes. This series of charts covers almost thirty years and different editions of the same map help show changes in the land over time. While many of the maps are from Arizona and the southwest region, some stretch out in each direction.

Series 6: Scrapbooks, 1957-1978, 13 ¹/₂ inches, 9 boxes

Saguaro Aviation's scrapbooks show a personal history of Saguaro Aviation by recording the recipients of various licenses and certificates. They also have a nice range of photographs to show changes over time. The last four scrapbooks have general information including photos, press clippings, Saguaro aviation advertisements, and a personal collection of cards and notes.

Series 7: Photographs, 1957-1978, 14 inches, 38 folders

The photographs in this series run the whole duration of the collection. Photos taken by many sources give an idea of Saguaro Aviation, Sky Harbor Airport and aviation in general at that time. Several photographs of manuevers by helicopters, aerial views of Sky Harbor and the Phoenix area, and photos of various aircraft would be most interesting for researchers.

Series 8: Negatives, 1957-1978, 17 1/2 inches

The negatives in this series match up with the photographs in the scrapbooks and in the photograph series. Most of the photographs have a corresponding negative. Oversized black and white negatives exist for the older photos in the collection, but eventually color film was used for later ones.

Series 9: Slides, 13 inches

The slides in this series run the duration of the collection. Photos taken by many sources give an idea of Saguaro Aviation, Sky Harbor Airport, and aviation in general at that time. Many of these slides were also developed into photographs in the scrapbooks. Especially interesting slides show weather in the valley including large banks of clouds moving in, rain, and beautiful sunsets. A few slides were used by Saguaro Aviation employees during presentations.

Series 10: Media, unknown dates, 6 ¹/₂ inches

This series consists of 5 - 16mm tapes and a view finder card of a Cessna aircraft. The reels of film were shot from the air.

Series 11: Realia, 3 inches

This series contains a wooden model and its metal casting of the Saguaro Aviation logo. It also contains two certificates mounted on wooden plaques, name plates of employees, and a plastic wallet with Saguaro Aviation printed on it.

PROVENANCE

These records were created by Saguaro Aviation. On June 11, 1981, Larry Fleming donated the Saguaro Aviation Records to the Arizona Historical Society, Central Arizona Division.

RESTRICTIONS

There are no restrictions on this collection.

NOTES TO RESEARCHERS

Scrapbook number one with the earliest photos of pilots passing examinations was disassembled and the photographs were housed in the photograph series. The few pieces of memorabilia in the scrapbook can be found in the beginning of the scrapbook series. The rest of the scrapbooks still remain intact. The books in this collection are filed first alphabetically by publisher and then are arranged chronologically within the series.
