BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: John Van Hengel ("Doc" or "Bud") was born on February 21, 1923 in Waupun, Wisconsin. He was the son of John Arnold Van Hengel, a pharmacist and Beverlee Eva Strasser, a nurse. He attended Lawrence University in Appleton, Wisconsin, receiving a degree in government in 1944. Van Hengel moved to Southern California where he met his wife Beverlee and gained financial success in retail sales management. His marriage ended in divorce in 1960. They had two sons, Thomas Michael "Mick" Van Hengel and John "Kip" Anthony Van Hengel.

After failing to reconcile with his ex-wife, Van Hengel moved back to Wisconsin. There he worked in a stone quarry and due to an altercation between two co-workers severely injured his spine and legs. His doctor recommended moving to Phoenix in hopes that the dry weather would improve his condition. He recovered and went to work as a volunteer with St. Vincent de Paul. Feeding the hungry became Van Hengel's purpose in life and food banking began. Locally and globally, it defined his sense of community and family.

Van Hengel, a religious man, maintained communication with members of the clergy throughout his life, including his maternal relatives Pat and Celesta Blackbird (members of the School Sisters of St. Francis) and close family friend Friar Daniel Lenihan of New Melleray Abbey. He served on a number of boards including Friendly House and Alpha-Omega. Van Hengel received numerous awards throughout his life including the Phoenix Valley Leadership Man of the Year Award in 1972, the Salvation Army Centennial Award in 1980, appointment as a Knight of the Order of St. Gregory the Great in 1994, and a Congressional Record Award for humanitarian work in 2003. He remained an advocate for the hungry until his death from Parkinson's disease on October 5, 2005 in Phoenix, Arizona at the age of 82.

HISTORICAL NOTE: St. Mary's Food Bank (SMFB) was founded in 1967 in Phoenix, Arizona by John Van Hengel and was the world's first food bank. John Van Hengel's life in Phoenix is inextricably tied to SMFB and is integral to the content of this collection.

The history of the first food bank began when John Van Hengel moved to Phoenix, Arizona in 1962 and began volunteering at the St. Vincent de Paul kitchen. He and other volunteers would pick excess citrus from neighborhood trees and haul it away to distribute to the hungry. Van Hengel met a mother who fed her children from the "waste" left behind in grocery store dumpsters. The food was edible and provided the family with nutritious meals. She went on to say there should be a bank instead of garbage cans to deposit extra food. Thus, the term food bank was born. Van Hengel found innovative ways to take advantage of food surplus which otherwise would go to waste.

In 1967, Father Ronald Colloty of St. Mary's Basilica responded with a gift of a small abandoned bakery at 816 S. Central St. in Phoenix along with a \$3,000 loan to begin work on behalf of the Franciscans. Although specifically and consistently a nonsectarian organization, St. Mary's Food Bank was named in honor of this initial donation. By the end of 1968, SMFB was able to repay the initial loan and by the second year, Van Hengel reported they had distributed "about a million pounds" of food. Van Hengel was the founder and first President of SMFB. Although he became involved with other organizations he always remained connected with St. Mary's.

"The poor we shall always have with us, but why the hungry?" became a mantra for SMFB. It is based on the notions that sufficient resources exist to provide food for everyone and that hunger is a universal and global human issue. St. Mary's initial growth was due to diverse and extensive community engagement and large-scale volunteerism. This extensive collaborative effort established SMFB as a vital partner to over 240 Phoenix agencies and cemented its reputation as a "clearinghouse."

- SMFB concentrated on soliciting food, rather than money to avoid competing with other service organizations.
- SMFB did not accept government funding or through fundraising organizations such as the United Way.
- SMFB purchased excess food directly from groceries and retailers at a deeply reduced bulk rates.
- SMFB paid attention to the nutritional value of the food and provided access to educational resources on cooking and nutrition.
- SMFB became experts in distribution and logistics by developing satellite locations and establishing regional service areas.

SMFB promoted a comprehensive solution to hunger and created a diverse array of social service programs.

- The Emergency Food Box Program, distributed nutritious food to agencies & caseworkers serving at-risk populations in crisis.
- Community Gardens provided a place to grow organic food on land provided by the State government.

- B.R.E.A.D. (Bridges Reaching the Elderly and Disabled) distributed food to disabled and homebound seniors.
- Breakfast for the Homeless, fed hundreds of people on a daily basis as well as provided opportunities to recruit volunteers.
- Community Kitchen, a (still active) culinary training course provided low-income adults with skills to obtain a job.

In 1976, Van Hengel was persuaded by the now-defunct Community Services Agency to accept an unsolicited federal grant intended to expand the food bank concept nationally. Van Hengel briefly resigned from the board of SMFB in order to establish Second Harvest. He returned to St. Mary's in 1982. Second Harvest went on to become Feeding America, currently the third largest charity in the United States.

The success of SMFB and the efforts of Van Hengel and his team also provided direction for the establishment of food banking internationally. Bob McCarty of SMFB and Second Harvest founded Canada's first food bank in Edmonton (1981), along with Mike Fagan and Joe Edison who were early "foodbankers" in Canada and Mexico. Van Hengel, Francis Lopez, and the SMFB team guided the establishment of the Food Bank of Paris by Bernard Dandrel in 1984 as well as the European Federation of Food Banks (FEBA) in Brussels by Andre Hubert in 1986. FEBA has gone to establish food banks throughout Europe. This community discourse grew substantially to include outreach and the establishment of hunger relief agencies in Asia, Africa, South America, and Australia.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: Original order is unknown. This collection, originally received on three pallets, required extensive weeding. It includes materials primarily created by John Van Hengel from mid-life until his death. Several previous attempts at arrangement and description had been attempted. (See Dennis Preisler's paper *John Van Hengel and The St. Mary's Food Bank*, Box 1, Folder 7.)

Despite the bulk, significant gaps exist in administrative files as well as correspondence. Much of Van Hengel's early life is not documented here. The collection documents the evolution of food banking and the increasing involvement of corporations, service groups, non-profits, and professional organizations.

Series I: Personal – VIP, family, and personal correspondence arranged alphabetically and chronologically within. Includes Van Hengel's written notes, histories of SMFB and the food banking industry, biographical materials and awards. Also includes correspondence between Van Hengel and prominent individuals such as Governor Jack Williams as well as key figures in the national and international food banking industries such as Margery and Al Feliksa, Sister Christine Vladimiroff OSB, Francis Lopez, and Andre Hubert. Van Hengel family names include Blackbird, Derus, and Strasser.

Series II: Administrative – Consists of general correspondence related to SMFB, memos, Board of Directors meeting minutes, public relations materials, architectural drawings, lists of contact agencies, and reports. Correspondence of individuals within the organization such as Alan Merrett, first Board President of St. Mary's and later Executive

Director, Bob McCarty, and Bill Bolling. Arranged alphabetically and chronologically within. This series includes correspondence and work of Priscilla Scheid who began as a volunteer at SMFB in 1971. She quickly took on many roles ranging from bookkeeper, fundraiser, newsletter editor, and public relations to Executive Director. Her presence is evident throughout this collection and is not limited to these folders.

Series III: Finance - Financial statements, donations, correspondence, fundraising reports, and tax documents arranged alphabetically and chronologically within.

Series IV: Programs - Includes an array of services and organizations created as the result of SMFB initiatives. Arranged alphabetically and chronologically within.

Series V: Publications – Includes domestic and international newsletters, pamphlets, promotional materials, and embedded correspondence. Arranged alphabetically by geographic location and chronologically within.

Series VI: Photographs – Documents John Van Hengels’s family and friends, SMFB staff, volunteers, events, facilities, and international subjects relating to food banking. Most of these individuals are unidentified. Arranged by subject and chronologically within. Notable Arizona figures include Sandra Day O’Connor, Phoenix Mayors Margaret Hance and John D. Driggs, Eddie Basha, and others.

Series VII: Newspaper Clippings - Arranged chronologically, relating to Van Hengel, SMFB, food banking industry and hunger.

Series VIII: Media - Arranged chronologically by format. VHS tapes sampled for condition and found viewable. Consists of public service announcements, television news clips, fundraising promotions, documentaries, John Van Hengel tributes and SMFB celebrations and events.

Series IX: Memorabilia and Oversize - Includes guest books, awards, plaques, commemorative plates, posters, agency lists, and small items such as medals and buttons. Plaques and plates are numbered in chronological order.
