BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Rosemary Drachman Taylor, author, was born in Phoenix in 1899, a daughter of the pioneer Drachman family. The daughter of Mose and Ethel Drachman, the family moved to Tucson in 1904. She attended the University of Arizona and then Stanford. She later worked as a war correspondent in Morocco, publishing her reports in the *Tucson Citizen* and *Chicago Tribune*. She gained national recognition when she published *Chicken Every Sunday* in 1943, a humorous account of life in her mother's Tucson boarding house. She published several other books and died at the age of 82 in 1981.
