DESCRIPTION

Collection includes a small amount of biographical information on the Udall family. There are copies of letters to David Udall concerning the townsite of St. Johns. The largest portion of correspondence is between Levi Udall and the Arizona Pioneers Historical Society. Collection also includes a speech that Udall gave to a Westerns group in 1958 on Mormon colonization in Arizona and a copy of a manuscript entitled *Some Reminiscences of the Pleasant Valley War and Causes that Led Up to It* by Osmer D. Flake.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Levi C. Udall, Arizona State supreme court justice, was born in St. Johns in 1891 and lived there all his life. His father, David K. Udall, founded the town of St. Johns. He was admitted to the State Bar of Arizona in 1922 and was elected Apache County attorney for two terms. He was named to the State Supreme Court in 1946 and died in 1960.
