# Jacob Mansfeld

## Highly Respected Tucson Citizen



-Born in Germany; attended school there until 14 years old



- Immigrated to San Francisco, CA in 1856 and became a partner in a bookstore
- Traveled through the West and arrived in Tucson in 1870



-Opened the small cigar store and *Pioneer News Depot* in Tucson on Congress Street and Main Avenue; also sold stationary products

-Established Tucson's first circulating library



-Served as a school board member

-Served on Pima County Board of Supervisors in 1885 and 1886



-Appointed Centennial Commissioner in 1876; represented the Territory of Arizona in Philadelphia

-Served on the committee which drafted the first charter for the City of Tucson

-Originated the idea that a university in Tucson would be of more benefit than to continue the fight to return the Capital to Tucson from Prescott

-Named member of the Board of Regents for the University of Arizona

-Fathered four children with wife, Eva Goldschmidt

-Died in 1894 of pneumonia
