BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: Theos Casimir Bernard was born in Los Angeles on December 10, 1908. Theos spent his early years in Tombstone, Arizona where his mother, Aura Georgina Crable-Bernard (later Gordon), was the first postmaster. His father left them while he was still a child.

Completing a bachelor's in Philosophy and a Degree in Law at the University of Arizona in 1934, he went on to study at Columbia University where he earned a doctorate in Anthropology and Oriental Studies in 1938. During his time at Columbia, Bernard traveled to India and Tibet to study Buddhist religion, philosophy, and customs. Bernard had been deeply interested in Buddhism since a bout of rheumatism in the fall of 1931 required three months of bed rest, time that allowed him to read his mother's collection of East Asian literature.

From that period till his death, Theos Bernard was a significant contributor to South East Asian religious studies. Invited to Tibet in 1936 to study the religious practices of the Lamas and monks, he was the first Caucasian man admitted to the sacred city of Lhasa, as well as the first initiated into the Tibetan-Buddhist priesthood. During his trip, Bernard collected many rare wood-block books and other original materials he later donated to Yale University. Between 1937 and 1947, he wrote five books and numerous articles concerning Yoga and Buddhism. In 1947, during his second expedition to the KI Monastery in Western Tibet, he disappeared while in the remote Kulu Valley of Northern Punjab. By most accounts, Theos Bernard was shot and killed by Tibetan peasants when his caravan was mistaken for a Muslim raiding party.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: This collection consists of biographical material collected by Professor J.M. Mahar and his research assistant, Carol Lingham, on the life of Theos Casimir Bernard, 1908-1947. Arranged in five series:

Series I: Biographical Research - The research centers on Theos Bernard's teenage experiences, college education, and adoption of Yoga and Buddhism. Contains information on

his travels in India and Tibet. Includes an annotated bibliography of Bernard's works, Bernard's family tree and timeline, and J.M. Mahar's manuscript <u>From Tombstone to Tibet: The Student Years of Theos C. Bernard.</u>

Series II: Correspondence - Correspondence centering on the early to mid-1980s is primarily of J.M. Mahar and Linham's requests for information on Theos Bernard. There is much correspondence between Mahar and Dr. Viola Bernard. Several original letters of Aura Gordon-Bernard and a few copies of Theos Bernard's letters

Series III: Newspaper Clippings - Contains biographical articles and obituaries

Series IV: Interviews - Contains transcripts of interviews, gathered in May of 1982 or 1983, of relatives and past acquaintances of Theos Bernard.

Series V: Miscellaneous Research and Notes - Contains notes, applications, and documents related to Theos Bernard and Tibet.
